# SUCCESSFUL GRANTS

**Adelaide Showgrounds  
Farmers' Market Inc.**



**\$4000 GRANTED**



A "cooking fresh" program was held on Sundays for the local community, focused on educating and promoting healthy seasonal eating while reducing food waste at home. This program was delivered over 12 months for 30 mins-1 hr each time.



**\$4000 GRANTED**



**Forestville Hockey Club**

Worn out or outdated training and safety equipment for the junior program was replaced, including 4 dozen training balls, goalie protective equipment, protective face masks and pitch hire at West Beach.



**Greek Women's Society** → **\$4000 GRANTED**

This society has 85 years of experience in offering culturally diverse programs and events underpinned by the principles of wellness, community participation and togetherness.



They delivered weekly strength training classes led by a personal trainer, followed by a social time of morning tea after the class.

**Hyde Park Croquet Club** → **\$4000 GRANTED**



The opportunity for members of the community to learn croquet for free was held on 4 consecutive Sunday afternoons, and 8 modern croquet mallets were purchased.



**\$4000 GRANTED** ← **Goodwood Community Services Inc.**

Health and wellbeing workshops for were held for residents that included yoga, meditation, Zumba, exercise healthy eating and art.



**\$4000 GRANTED** ← **Vishva Hindu Parishad**

Established in 2015, Vishva Hindi Parishad has been serving the Hindu community with services in the field of social service, education and cultural development.



New equipment, including cutlery and crockery, was purchased, allowing community members to serve hot meals.



**Italian Folk Ensemble**



**\$3980 GRANTED**



The group helps strengthen the awareness of the cultural depth that is present in our multicultural society.

Their work on music across regions all over Italy are well respected in the community.

This non-profit organisation has researched Italian Folk music for over 40 years. The musical group has reproduced folk songs and dance tunes in their original style and respective Italian dialects.

The front entry of the hall at the Greek Orthodox Church underwent upgrades, including the addition of a ramp.

**Clarence Park  
Community Centre**



Workshops with the Playgroup created art that celebrates the environment, including hanging art sculptures in the Children's Garden.

**Sturt Bowling Club**



6 new sets smaller sized of bowls were purchased, supporting greater female participation. The pergola and barbecue area at the Club was also completed, with further weather proofing.



**Latvian Co-op Society  
Social Club Inc.**



**\$2300 GRANTED**



The Latvian Association of South Australia organises literary lunches and supports several initiatives, including the local Latvian library, bookshop, senior support groups, and choir.

They purchased new cutlery and crockery to help provide a community service operated by volunteers who prepare and serve food.

**Greek Pensioners & Aged  
Society Inc.**



**\$2000 GRANTED**



This group has up to 100 attendees each week, where volunteers cook lunch, bingo is hosted, and seniors are given the opportunity to connect. The Society also provides a bus trip to the South Coast with lunch.

**Highgate Girl Guides**

40 chairs and 6 trestle tables were replaced in the Guide hall, helping not only the Girl Guides, but also the wider community who hire the hall.
